

LAKESIDE PARK-CRESTVIEW HILLS POLICE AUTHORITY BOARD

Regular Meeting – June 15, 2020

CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Lakeside Park-Crestview Hills Police Authority Board was called to order at 5:30 pm. by Chairman Bill Dorsey. *Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the meeting was held on the video teleconference platform WebEx.*

ATTENDANCE: Those in attendance were Bill Dorsey, Paul Markgraf, David Kramer and Brian Waite. Absent was Joe Roesel. Also in attendance were Chief Schutte, Lt. Col. Degenhardt, Sgt. Paolucci and Melissa Sies.

MINUTES: Mr. Kramer made a motion to accept the May minutes. Mr. Markgraf seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL: The May financial statements were reviewed. After a review of the bills, Mr. Markgraf made a motion to pay the bills. Mr. Waite seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

- 1.) Recruit Nick Metzger is doing well in his Field Training.
- 2.) Recruit Justin Holman has completed his testing and his start date will be July 7.
- 3.) Both recruits have a September Academy start date; will graduate in February and will complete their post-academy Field Training by May 2021.
- 4.) Chapman is retiring on June 30.

Mr. Kramer asked Chief Schutte if the officers had access to “de-escalation training”. Chief Schutte stated that the department has access to this type of training through DOCJT. Chief Schutte further stated that the officers will also be receiving advanced defensive tactics training beginning in July 2020.

Mr. Waite asked Chief Schutte what the morale was in the department, due to the current situation throughout the nation with police/community relations. Mr. Waite further inquired if the board could do anything to further assist the officers. Chief Schutte stated that he is researching possible ideas and will submit a proposal to the Board in July or August.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Crestview Hills – Mr. Kramer reported that the city had the 2nd reading of the 2020/2021 budget; they passed an updated order for expanding outdoor dining; there are 6 people running for 6 council spots.

Lakeside Park – Mr. Markgraf reported that the city passed a new animal ordinance; the 2020/2021 budget has been approved; and there are 7 people running for 6 council spots.

OLD BUSINESS:


