Regular Meeting – July 18, 2022

CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Lakeside Park-Crestview Hills Police Authority Board was called to order at 1730 hrs by Vice-Chairman Paul Markgraf.

<u>Lakeside Park</u> – The regular meeting was July 11th – The city had a first reading of an ordinance restricting parking on Hudson Avenue, the city approved a municipal order appointing Janet Fedders to the Ethics Board.
