

LAKESIDE PARK-CRESTVIEW HILLS POLICE AUTHORITY BOARD

Regular Meeting – July 19, 2021

CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Lakeside Park-Crestview Hills Police Authority Board was called to order at 1730 hrs by Paul Markgraf.

ATTENDANCE: Those in attendance were Paul Markgraf, David Kramer, Matt Stegman, and Brian Waite. Also in attendance was Chief Schutte.

MINUTES: Mr. Waite made a motion to accept the June minutes. Mr. Kramer seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL: The June financial statements were reviewed along with June's reconciliations. After a review of the bills, Mr. Kramer made a motion to pay the bills. Mr. Stegman seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

- 1.) Sgt. Paolucci is planning a possible 2nd student police academy in collaboration with Thomas More University. The first academy was an extra-curricular activity, however this academy would part of an actual class. It is tentatively scheduled for the Spring semester (2022).
- 2.) The department participated in a round table discussion with Senator Rand Paul to discuss issues facing the law enforcement profession.
- 3.) Officers Holman and Metzger have completed their field training and now operating in solo patrol capacity.
- 4.) Lt. Col. Degenhardt graduated from Leadership Northern Kentucky.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Crestview Hills – The regular meeting was July 8th – The city had a first reading of an ordinance approving an enactment and adoption to the code of ordinances, a first reading of an ordinance amending the occupational license - enacting a gross taxation model, and a first of a reading of an ordinance amending the city's alcohol hours. The city approved two resolutions for construction projects on Lookout Farm Drive and Varsity Court. The city declared some computer equipment as surplus.

Lakeside Park – The regular meeting was July 12th – The city introduced Lori Remley as the liaison for the city from PDS. The Paul Hesser Drive construction project is underway. The sober living house on Applewood Drive has been sold. The city is planning on having an open house for the new city building this fall. The city has hired Courtney Mueller as the recreation director.

Oxford House: Mr. Markgraf mentioned that there was recent activity on social media about possible suspicious activity at the Oxford Sober Living House on Carran Drive. Chief Schutte stated that the department had not received any recent complaints regarding the Oxford House on Carran Drive. Chief Schutte further stated that it has been observed that sometimes individuals post complaints on social media about suspicious activity in their neighborhood but do not actually call the police department. He stated that citizens should call the police department when they observe suspicious activity so the police can respond and address it.
