

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE
MEETING MINUTES
Wednesday, May 4, 2022
9:00 A.M.

Present: Chairperson Tim McKinley, Mayor Paul Meier, Genie Wambaugh, Ed Wise

Staff Present: City Administrator Alex Mattingly, Public Works Director John Scheben

Chairperson Tim McKinley called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. and led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The first item considered was approval of the April 6, 2022 meeting minutes. Genie Wambaugh motioned to approve and Ed Wise seconded, all voting in favor.

Continuing Business

A. Turkeyfoot Road Improvement Project – Mayor Meier reported that the most recent state government transportation budget still showed money allocated only for project design in the amount of \$3.5 million.

B. Upcoming Roadwork, Shinkle Rd. and Summit Repaving – This project is on track to be bid in June 2022; delays have been caused by storm sewer design issues.

C. City Engineer RFQ – The committee recommended that Mike Yeager with Prime AE Engineers be named the contract Crestview Hills City Engineer. Mayor Meier formally appointed Mr. Yeager to the role on May 3, 2022.

D. I-275 Noise Study (western Lookout Farm) – Alex Mattingly made contact with Mike Bezold with Kentucky Transportation Cabinet recently to alert KYTC to the ongoing noise issues in this area. Mr. Mattingly asked that KYTC include a noise study and related investigatory work in the upcoming I-75/I-275 Interchange Redesign Project, and Mr. Bezold stated that this could be done in some form in the near future.

E. Horsebranch Rd. Sidewalks – Mayor Meier updated the committee on the progress for this joint SNK Fund grant application with the City of Edgewood, including that CT Consultants has updated its estimates for the project. Crestview Hills' 20% match increased to around \$700,000 due to inflation and lack of contractor availability. Applications for SNK Fund grants are due to OKI Regional Council of Governments on June 3, 2022.

F. Dixie Hwy. Sidewalk Improvements (Whitehouse Drive to North City Boundary with Lakeside Park) – John Scheben reported that KYTC provided comments on the proposed project,

which would be incorporated into the design. The updated estimate for this project is \$121,000. Mr. Scheben is investigating grant opportunities to help fund this work.

Staff Report

- A. Mr. Mattingly reported that the City is aware of the issues with the Legends Way repair by the Northern Kentucky Water District (stemming from a recent water main repair). Mr. Scheben is working with NKWD to get this section of roadway corrected.
- B. Mr. Scheben reported that citywide street sweeping was occurring on April 6 in Crestview Hills. The City is using a new contractor that is based out of Lexington.

The next meeting of the Committee is scheduled for Wednesday, June 1, 2022, at 9:00 a.m.
