City Adopts 2011-2012 Annual Budget

The City Council in June adopted the budget for Fiscal Year 2010-2011. Several highlights of the new budget include:

- Total appropriations of \$ 3,091,986. This represents an increase of \$ 139,503 over the prior year budget. The City was diligent in identifying areas to cut back from last year to balance significant increases in the Police Authority contribution (\$130,347, or 12.7% increase over FY 2010-2011).
- The total increase amounted to 4.7% over last year's budget.
- The City has budgeted for several significant maintenance projects in the new budget. Those include the final phase in upgrading street signs and posts, repairs to the bridges at Shinkle Road and Lookout Farm Drive, re-paving Horsebranch Road, matching funds for the Dixie Highway Sidewalk project, and repairs to the City Building. The City also added funds to 'crack-seal' several streets to prolong their lifespan
- Revenues are anticipated to increase a small amount over the current year. Due to the economic downturn, business net profit taxes are projected to be substantially lower than the last few years, and payroll taxes will increase slightly.
- The budget anticipates the City Council will take the compensating property tax rate. (The same revenue as last year)

Overall, the City maintains a healthy reserve and continues to fund ongoing expenses. We have been fortunate to not experience the same decreases in revenues seen by other cities, but must deal with rising operating and maintenance costs just like other communities. SUMMER STREET PAVING

The City routinely assesses the condition of all streets and sidewalks in the community. Streets are rated on a system from '1' to '9'. Those streets rated in poor condition (5 or below) are prioritized for paving and repair. The City's Public Works Committee then reviews the recommended list and prepares a final street paving list based on the City's budget.

This year the City plans to pave and/or repair portions of the following streets:

- * Shinkle Road
- * Horsebranch Road
- * Centre View Blvd.
- * College Park

Minor street repairs will also occur throughout the summer. Please be on the lookout for street work and be cautious when entering the construction zone.



Finally, the City is always interested in hearing from residents if you see a street or sidewalk that needs attention. Please call Public Works Supervisor Jeff Smith at the City offices to report this repair work.

NKAPC Offers Services in Crestview Hills



As noted in a series of recent articles, the City has chosen a model in which most services are contracted with outside vendors. Among those services, the City has contracted with the Northern Kentucky Area Planning Commission (NKAPC) to provide a range of inspection and planning services within our community.

Founded in the 1960's as a regional approach to planning in Northern Kentucky, the Northern Kentucky Area Planning Commission has grown to encompass not only planning, but also building inspection, Geographic Information Systems (mapping), and code enforcement. Their services are funded by a property tax (\$.32 per \$1,000 of assessed value) for Kenton County residents, as well as building inspection and review fees. NKAPC prepares the comprehensive plan for the community (required by State Law), assists the City in its Zoning Code, and prepares periodic updates to subdivision regulations.

Crestview Hills has two representatives on the Area Planning Council (the governing board for NKAPC) and one appointed citizen representative on the Kenton County Planning Commission. NKAPC provides professional planning assistance for zoning and board of adjustment issues, acts as the zoning board for the City (recommending zone changes, approving subdivision and development plans), and provides all building inspection services for new construction and remodeling. NKAPC also provides Code Enforcement assistance for City Nuisance complaints (high grass, litter, etc).

A unified approach to planning provides a more consistent development pattern for the county, and ensures that incompatible uses (for instance heavy industrial and residential) are not adjacent to one another from one city boundary to another.

Crestview Hills Recycles!

Recent statistics from Rumpke show an average of 650 homes are setting out recycle bins over the past two weeks. The weights of the past two recycling pick ups were 3.54 tons on June 14th and 3.34 tons on June 21th. Over 50% of Crestview Hills residents appear to be participating in recycling! Most communities are between 25% to 35% participation. Additionally, the amount of material historically being recycled in Crestview Hills on a monthly basis results in the equivalent of roughly two garbage truck loads!



This is the material that would have otherwise gone to the landfill each month.

Remember that the City can provide you with an additional recycling container, by just stopping by the City Building at 50 Town Center Boulevard. Rumpke will accept many types a recycled material, including cardboard, paper, newsprint, and many types of plastic. For more information, please call Rumpke Recycling at 859-472-7339.
